Humber Named Meritorious Hospital by American College of Surgeons

Humber has been named a Meritorious Hospital by the American College of Surgeons' National Surgical Quality Improvement Program (ACS NSQIP). All eligible hospitals were evaluated in two categories, all cases and high-risk only, and Humber was one of 40 hospitals recognized in both areas. Humber is also one of only six hospitals in Canada to receive this award.






Medical Radiation and Imaging Technologists (MRIT) Week - November 6 - 12

MRIT Week is an annual celebration of the essential role that Medical Radiation and Imaging Technologists (MRITs) play in the healthcare system. At Humber, they work in General X-ray, Ultrasound, CT, MRI, Interventional Radiology, Breast Health and Nuclear Medicine. MRITs deliver professional imaging and radiation-related treatment services with a caring touch, allowing patients to fully benefit from the latest in medical diagnostic and treatment technology. Our technologists play an integral role in the healthcare team to diagnose and provide minimally invasive treatments to patients.















World Diabetes Day - November 14

On World Diabetes Day, we highlighted our team at the Diabetes Education Clinic, who work with patients to look for patterns that contribute to their high blood sugar levels and help them take control of their health. Physicians and nurse practitioners can refer patients to the Diabetes Education Centre for support and education on medication management and dietary/lifestyle modifications.

On World Prematurity Day, we raise awareness of preterm birth, as well as highlight concerns, treatments, and strategies to maintain a healthy pregnancy. On this day, we featured the team in Humber's NICU, who commonly assist babies with concerns of prematurity.



MoreOB Event - November 23

Managing Obstetrical Risk Efficiently (MoreOB) is a patient safety program for healthcare providers and administrators in hospital obstetric units. MoreOB has been implemented widely in Canada and the main goal of the program is to build a patient safety culture and improve clinical outcomes.

In November, Humber's multidisciplinary maternal and child teams successfully participated in MoreOB, including nurses, OBGYNs, family OBs, anesthesiologists, and midwives. The goals of this session were to practice the teams response to obstetric emergencies, work on high-performing teamwork, and identify any systems issues that may hinder patient care. Multidisciplinary teams managed simulated emergencies to ensure they are equipped to manage real emergencies that may occur in the birthing unit. No real patients participated.









Canadian Patient Safety Week 2022 - Door Decoration Contest

Cyber Security at Humber ®

As a pioneer in the digital health sector, Humber faces daily cyber-attack attempts and remains a constant target for cybercriminals. Although Humber is well-equipped with state-of-the-art security tools to prevent and respond to most cyber incidents, it is inevitable that a small number of malicious phishing emails will get through. Therefore, cyber security awareness and best practices are essential to minimize future cyber attacks. As October was Cyber Security Awareness Month, Humber ran Cyber Security Awareness Phishing Campaign from October 5 to October 21.

Results from campaigns showed that there had been an increase in staff participation to report the phishing emails over the three weeks of the campaign, and a decrease in the number of staff getting phished. 50 winners were selected based on who was first to report the phishing emails. On November 10, Peter Bak, Chief Information Officer, and Kevin Fernandes, Chief Technology Officer, presented the winners with \$50 gift cards.

Strategic Planning Update

Diversity, Equity & Inclusion


Diversity and Inclusion Minute


