## **Shoe Sale Report: March 2024**

The Volunteer Association again sponsored a very successful shoe sale from March 25 to March 27. We sold almost \$75,000 worth of shoes and boots. After taxes, our share was 20% which was approximately \$13,000. The set-up crew showed their experience on Sunday afternoon; the truck was unloaded and the shoes stacked onto racks by size in about 1.5 hours. There was a generous amount of time left before we opened the doors to friends and family at 3 o'clock. There was a very high volume of shoppers Sunday afternoon and all day Monday but volunteers kept the display as neat as possible. 
