The hours of operation are 6:30 am to 7:00 pm Monday to Friday and 8:00 am to 4:00 pm Saturday and Sunday. The new green vouchers available to volunteers (one per shift) provide a \$2 discount on any purchase at both our Tims sites and at Starbucks. On opening day, our president gave Starbucks reusable red cups to the first 100 customers.



Shoes are \$60 per pair with boots costing more. A wide selection of men's shoes will also be available. There will be no children's shoes. At the sale last March, we sold over \$75,000 worth of shoes, our most successful sale ever! We need your help. Set up day is Sunday, March 24 from 11 to 3. Family and friends: you are invited to be the first in the door on Sunday from 3 to 5. The public sale day hours are 7 to 6 on Monday and Tuesday and 7 to 12 on Wednesday.
