### **Redesigning the Lactation Model of Care**






## **Health Unit Coordinator Appreciation Day - August 23**

## **International Overdose Awareness Day - August 31**



### **National Day for Truth and Reconciliation/Orange Shirt Day**

The day honours the survivors of residential schools, their families, and the communities of Indigenous peoples. September 30 also marks Orange Shirt Day – an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the impact made on Indigenous peoples by the residential school system. As this day quickly approaches, we kindly encourage you to wear orange on **Monday**, **September 30**.

As the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day approaches, Humber is committed to recognizing the significance this day holds to those involved. We encourage all of our staff, physicians and volunteers to honour this day through personal reflection, education and/or by participating in Indigenous-led initiatives within our community.
