Monthly Highlights

Surgical Team: Excellence in Quality Improvement Implementation

We congratulate our Surgical Program as Humber River Health was recently awarded Excellence in Quality Improvement Implementation from the Ontario Surgical Quality Improvement Network (ON-SQIN). Due to our Surgical Team's dedication to innovative practices, Humber was also nominated in several additional categories including, Greatest Improvement in Surgical Outcomes, the Innovation award, and the Green OR award. Two of our Surgical Clinical Reviewers, Dhatri Shukla and Joselyne Hernandez were also nominated for Most Engaged Surgical Clinical Reviewer.

Additionally, in October, the American College of Surgeons National Surgical Quality Improvement Program (ACS NSQIP) recognized 77 out of 609 eligible hospitals participating in the ACS NSQIP Adult Program for achieving Meritorious Outcomes for Surgical Patient Care in eight surgical care outcome areas:



mortality, cardiac (arrest and MI), pneumonia, unplanned intubation, ventilator>48 hrs, renal failure, SSIs and UTIs. Meritorious Outcomes are recognized in all cases, high risk categories and for two or more consecutive years. Nine Ontario hospitals were recognized in at least one of these categories, but Humber is one of four hospitals in the province that received Meritorious Outcomes designation in all three categories.

Our Surgical Teams successfully integrate the Hospital's surgical quality metrics with our operational metrics, allowing the organization to sustain many ON-SQIN campaigns. By using real-time data to build upon past and existing initiatives, our Surgical Program consistently finds ways to improve surgical processes, outcomes, and experiences, allowing Humber to excel in comparison to other Ontario hospitals.

Stroke Unit Team: 2024-2025 Designated Best Practice Stroke Unit Award

We are thrilled to share that our Stroke Unit Working Group at Humber has received the 2024-2025 Designated Best Practice Stroke Unit Award from the Toronto Stroke Network. To receive the award, the criteria was to meet 60 per cent of the CorHealth Ontario Stroke Unit definition components.



For the second year in a row, Humber has exceeded the established criteria due to their continuous improvement in meeting the Hospital's Stroke Unit Standards of Care.

Access to stroke unit care reduces the likelihood of death and disability by as much as 30 per cent for individuals of any age, saving and restoring thousands of lives in Ontario. Through continuous research, education, and implementation, our Stroke Unit Team succeeds in providing our patients with the comprehensive care they need to improve their outcomes.

Congratulations to our Surgical and Stroke Unit Teams on these exceptional accomplishments and in recognition of their commitment to excellence and to innovating healthcare.





Thank you to our MRIT team for your unwavering dedication and precision. Your work is fundamental to the health and safety of our patients, staff and community!








Diabetes Awareness Month




















Remembrance Day - November 11

In addition, we hosted a Remembrance Day Ceremony, where we sang O Canada, had a minute of silence, and a wreath laying. Thank you to everyone who attended.




Annual CQuIPS Symposium - November 19



Darlene Ginsberg and Fayrial Leung presented our Chemical Dependency Program Re-design at the CQuIPS Symposium, which includes improved access to opiate agonist therapy, naloxone kit training for staff, and improved severity scores for depression and anxiety for patients in our day program.

Our Maternal and Child Program shared their presentation, "FAST: Optimization of Elective C/S Processes to Reduce Delays," at the CQuIPS Symposium. The FAST (Flow and Assessment of c-Section Team) Project aimed to reduce significant delays in elective c-sections.
